Responsibilities and duties (*Training will be given in all these areas*) As a hotel receptionist, you will undertake a range of activities in a typical working day including:

- Welcoming guests and making them feel comfortable.
- Checking bookings and allocating guests their rooms
- Completing administrative tasks such as filing and photocopying
- Responding to guests' requests for help and information
- Assist in providing services, such as arranging taxis and providing information about local amenities and attractions.
- Preparing room bills and ensuring prompt payments.
- Checking guests out, taking payments, and returning deposits
